Community Support Services

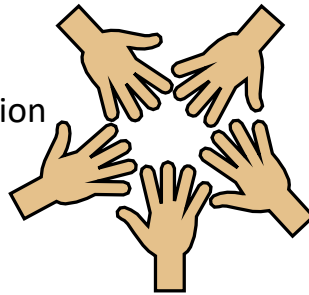
Caregiver Support

Caregiver support is available for those providing support to seniors or vulnerable adults.

Caregiver supports can take many forms from emotional support, information and referrals to service coordination and education.

Contact us for the following:

- Assistance with service coordination and system navigation
- Information and referrals
- Virtual caregiver workshops



Friendly Visiting

The Friendly Visiting program matches volunteers who live in the community with clients who are interested in a regular social visit.

- Telephone visits or in-person visits
- Help people to feel more connected to their community, reduce isolation and foster relationships between individuals
- No cost.

Handy Helpers

The Handy Helper program matches volunteers with clients who need assistance with small, one-time odd jobs and household tasks.

Home Help Directory

The Home Help Directory is a referral program designed to link clients seeking help at home with screened independent service providers.

- Referrals available for: light and heavy housekeeping, home maintenance and respite care
- Service request can be for ongoing service or one time



Grocery Supports

CSS grocery supports are designed to link clients with food resources. Our Service Coordinators support clients to access grocery delivery and premade meal options.

The Grocery Bus

This program provides transportation to and from a local grocery store on a yellow school bus. Volunteers are available on the bus and while shopping.

- Biweekly on Wednesdays
- 5\$ per trip

Community Support Services

LunchAbility

The LunchAbility program is a monthly recreational group for adults 18-59 living with physical disabilities. A great opportunity to socialize, meet new people and try fun activities, LunchAbility is a group where connections and friendships are formed.



Telephone Assurance Program

The Telephone Assurance Program (TAP) provides staff/volunteers who regularly, on week days, phone to check on a client's well-being and provide a predetermined response if the call is not answered. Clients work with the Service Coordinator to decide on a response plan that best meets their needs. Sometimes a friendly call can be a great way to start the day!



Transportation to Medical Appointments

Transportation program provides rides to and from medical appointments within Ottawa. Our Transportation program is available to seniors and adults living with a physical disability who can transfer safely and independently into a vehicle.

- Fees are based on round-trip kilometers (from client's home):
- Clients are able to bring a companion for the ride at no additional cost
- Rides are scheduled in advance and must be booked with at least 10 days' notice



1 to 10.99 kms = \$12	11 to 20.99 kms = \$14
21 to 49.99 kms = \$19	50 kms and over = \$27

Snow Go Assist

Snow Go Assist (SGA) is a City of Ottawa program, which provides eligible seniors and persons with disabilities with financial assistance to hire a contractor of their choosing to clear snow from private driveways and walkways.

- Application forms available as of late September
- Reimbursement of up to 50% of the cost of snow removal services, up to a seasonal maximum



Nursing Foot Care Clinic

The clinic provides assessment and treatment of various foot problems, routine care, prevention, teaching and diabetic care.

- By appointment only
- 20\$ per visit
- Call to check availability.
