Practical, in-home supports are provided by centre staff, volunteers and independent contractors who have been screened (including a police record check for the vulnerable sector). As a not-for profit committed to health equity, we aim to connect clients to high quality services that are offered at low-cost or no-cost.

Services Available

CAREGIVER SUPPORT

Caregiver support is for those providing support to seniors or vulnerable adults. Caregiver supports can take many forms from emotional support, information and referrals to service coordination and education. Contact us for the following:

- Assistance with service coordination and system navigation
- Information and referrals
- Caregiver information sessions and outreach

FRIENDLY VISITING

The Friendly Visiting program matches volunteers who live in the community with clients who are interested in a regular social visit.

- In-home or telephone visits
- Help people to feel more connected to their community, reduce isolation and foster relationships between individuals
- No cost.

HANDY HELPERS

The Handy Helper program matches volunteers with clients who are in need of assistance with small, one-time odd jobs and household tasks.

- Tasks may include (but are not limited to): changing light bulbs or smoke detector batteries, putting up shelves, hanging pictures and setting up phones and/or TV/DVD players etc.
- No cost, client must provide materials needed for job i.e. battery, lightbulb etc...

HOME HELP DIRECTORY

The Home Help Directory is a referral program designed to link clients seeking help at home with screened independent service providers.

- Referrals available for: light and heavy Housekeeping, Home Maintenance and Respite Care
- Service request can be for ongoing service or one-time

LUNCHABILITY

The LunchAbility program is a monthly recreational group for adults 18-59 living with physical disabilities. With an aim of trying new things and exploring our community, LunchAbility is a group where connections and friendships are formed.

- Fully accessible events and locations
- Includes a nutritious meal or snack
- Attendant care and volunteer support available at all events
- Cost \$5.00 per outing.

Services Available

SNOW GO ASSIST

Snow-Go Assist (SGA) is a City of Ottawa program, which provides eligible seniors and persons with disabilities with financial assistance to hire a contractor of his/her choosing to clear snow from private driveways and walkways.

- Application available beginning of October
- Reimbursement up to 50% of the cost of snow removal services up to a seasonal maximum

TRANSPORTATION TO MEDICAL APPOINTMENTS

Transportation program provides rides to and from medical appointments within Ottawa. Our Transportation program is available to seniors and adults living with a physical disability who can transfer safely and independently into a vehicle.

- Fees are based on round-trip kilometers (from client's home): 0– 20 KM: \$12; 21-50 KM: \$17; 51 KM or more: \$25
- Clients are able to bring a companion for the ride at no additional cost
- Rides are scheduled in advance and must be booked with at least 10 days notice
- Parking fees are the responsibility of client at time of parking. Free Parking at local hospitals

THE GROCERY BUS

The Grocery Bus program is more than just a shopping trip! This program provides grocery shopping support to clients AND a vibrant social community.

- Bi-weekly service;
- Staffed transportation (yellow school bus) to and from a local grocery store;
- Shopping support from volunteers;
- free grocery delivery (provided by store);
- \$5.00 Fee.

VOLUNTEER PROGRAM

The Volunteer Program matches volunteers from the community to volunteer opportunities at any of the Centre's three sites or to off-site opportunities in the community.
